STUDY Draft Results Policies Review

TOPICS

Staff has prepared a series of presentations over the past 14 months covering the key issues from our last strategic plan update, accomplishments since that time, a summary of common issues facing the utility overall, and critical priorities identification. A visioning exercise confirmed that the critical issues are consistent with past plans; however, new priorities emerged to shape the focus within those critical issue areas. A little over a decade ago, a policy governance model was implemented at the HBPW. Sometimes referred to as the Carver's Policy Governance® Model, the structure defines the relationship between the Board and staff through delegation and results policies.

Delegation policies define the boundaries (what is not acceptable) staff must work within. Results policies define the expected outcomes that recipients of the organization's work are expected to receive. In accordance with Delegation Policy D004 Monitoring Performance of the General Manager, the General Manager's performance is "measured by comparing HBPW's accomplishments against the Board's Results Policies and by comparing HBPW's operational conduct with the limits established by the Board's Delegation Policies".

While we have had a robust and effective set of Delegation Policies since the policy governance structure was implemented, we have never had a set of Results Policies defining the Board's expectations with regard to the expected outcomes or "Ends." In recognition of Carver's Policy Governance® Model, this work session focuses on organizational performance and conduct in relation to the Results Policies. To assist the Board with draft Results Policies for consideration, HBPW sought assistance from John Miner of Collaboration Unlimited.
